A Revolutionary Development Flexible Roll Film: 1884-1889

Photography didn't truly become accessible to amateurs until the mid-1880s when inventor George Eastman began producing film on rolls. In contrast to the previously used glass plates, the roll encouraged photographers to take multiple pictures with ease.

It became the primary selling point of Eastman's first Kodak camera. And, even better, customers could send the film back to the Kodak to have their images developed.

The easy-to-use camera was marked with the slogan "You press the button, we do the rest."

Unfortunately, the coated paper film produced fairly low- quality photos. This changed a year later when the paper was replaced with celluloid, and this remained the standard for nearly a century until the development of digital cameras.
